

A Memorandum of the history of the Chapel named St. Mary's By The Sea at Fenwick. Written by Mrs. Francis Goodwin at the request of Mr. J. H. Kelso Davis.

During the summer of 1880 religious services were held every Sunday morning by The Rev. Francis Goodwin in the living room of his cottage, and there was a general attendance of the summer residents of Fenwick and a few from the hotel. In time the congregation grew until it seemed best to have a chapel, which Mr. Goodwin built on his own land back of his cottage, and for some years the summer colony gathered there for Divine Service.

Later, however, the chapel was too small for those who desired to worship there, and an addition being necessary, it was thought best to take it out of private hands. Mr. G. W. Root gave the land on which the chapel now stands to an Association, and the building was removed to that spot and an addition to the east was built by subscription.

The lectern, which once belonged to Trinity Church, Hartford, was given by Mr. Goodwin. The altar coverings were worked by the Misses Jackson of Middletown, Connecticut, and the vases and cross given by Mr. Goodwin. Upon the death of Bishop Knight of Milwaukee, who had long resided at Fenwick and taken many services in the chapel, the memorial window in the chancel was erected to his memory. Recently Mrs. John C. Wilson gave the font in memory of her two children.

Dean Hart of Middletown was much interested in the chapel and frequently preached there.

Mr. Lucius Barbour has played the organ and directed the choir of children for many years.

During the War the services were discontinued for one summer and the chapel used for Red Cross work.

DESCRIPTION OF CARVING ON THE COMMUNION RAIL
AT ST. MARY'S BY-THE-SEA, FENWICK, CONNECTICUT

In designing this Communion Rail, Mr. Wiggins had the idea of representing in symbolic form the Holy Bible as the foundation of Christian faith. Of the eight carved figures, the four center ones represent the four Evangelists, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The figures on each side of them are typical writers of the Epistles and the two figures on the extreme right and left represent the Old Testament which was called by the Hebrews The Law and the Prophets. In addition to the carved figures, a small medallion over the head of each one is symbolic of the man represented and adds to the identification.

The first figure on the left is that of Moses. He is shown holding the tablets of the Law and carved above his head is a serpent to illustrate the well-known story of the Serpent in the Wilderness. Corresponding to him on the extreme right is the Prophet Elijah who is shown in the rough garb of the Hebrew Prophet and on his medallion the ravens who fed him in the Wilderness. It will be remembered in the Gospel account of the Transfiguration, Moses and Elijah appeared on the mountain as representing the Law and the Prophets in the vision which the three chosen Apostles shared with Christ.

The second figure from the left and the second from the right are authors of the Epistles. On the left is St. Paul holding a great sword, the symbol of his martyrdom. It is common in Christian art to have the martyr represented as holding in his hands the means of his death. On the medallion is a lizard which in medieval times

recovered its sight when blinded by staring at the sun.
~~was supposed to be able to look at the sun without winking. It should~~
should be remembered that St. Paul at the time of his conversion
saw a great light from heaven which blinded him, though he later
recovered. The lizard is used as his particular beast.

For St. Peter, the second figure from the right, the Medallion shows
of course the rooster which crowed three times when Peter denied
his Lord. He is holding as usual the great key of Heaven.
That leaves the four Evangelists for the four central figures,
placed in the traditional order, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, from
left to right. Each one in Christian art has his symbol corresponding
to the four beasts in the Book of the Revelation. St. Matthew is re-
presented by the head of a man, St. Mark by a lion, St. Luke by a
bull and St. John by an eagle. St. Matthew is shown holding a book in
his hand to remind us that he was a publican and collector of taxes
when he was called to be an Apostle. He holds a pen in his right
hand, a symbol of his authorship of the First Gospel. St. Mark and
St. Luke each hold a book inscribed with their names to represent the
Gospel they wrote. St. John holds in his hand the cup which he shared
with the Master at the Last Supper. There is a strange tradition that
one one occasion some dastard heathen tried to secure the death of
St. John by concealing a poisonous snake in the chalice with which
he was to celebrate the Last Supper. For this reason he is sometimes
shown in medieval art holding a chalice with a serpent coming out
of the top, but Mr. Wiggins naturally omitted that gruesome reference
for which there is of course no historical foundation.

This feature is especially helpful in preparing Convention reports, Anniversary sermons, etc.

Explanation.

The partly filled page will show the appearance of the book when in use. The blanks at the top of page for date make it possible to quickly refer to any week for reference. The column for record of the number of services is divided into two sections, for Sundays and week-days, so that by numbering each service in order, beginning at No. 1, and entering in the proper column, a complete record of the number of Sunday and week-day services is kept. The same way provision is made for the separate record of public and private celebrations of the Holy Communion, and the number of communicants at each service. Space is left for "remarks" or for the signature of the Preacher at any special service, or the record of hymns sung. The book will last the average parish about four years.

THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS

A few months ago a man in my parish died away from home, and when I went to see his widow, the undertaker was there making arrangements. The widow was controlling herself as best she could. She said, "I can't help feeling that Jim is right here in this room. Of course I know that he isn't here, but I just . . ." I said, "He is here."

A spirit is not bound by place or time. It can be anywhere and everywhere. When we say a person has gone to heaven, we have no reason to think that he is separated from us. Heaven is not a place, nor is it far away. Those who have gone on before us to a better land are not herded off into another fold, but there is one fellowship of all faithful people in all times and all places, and neither life nor death nor any other creature can separate us from it. That is what we mean when we say in the Creed, "I believe in . . . the Holy Catholic Church; the Communion of Saints."

If you look at the punctuation in the Creed, you will notice something that Dr. Drury used to point out. Most of the main clauses are separated by a colon, but those clauses most closely connected are separated by a semicolon. There is only a semicolon between "the Holy Catholic Church" and "the Communion of Saints." Really, those are merely two ways of saying

the same thing. "Communion" means "fellowship." In the King James Version you will find the expression, "the Communion of the Holy Ghost" where the Prayer Book has "the fellowship of the Holy Ghost."

So we believe in the Fellowship or Companionship of Saints. Now when we talk about saints we usually mean some extraordinary people who are five times as good and fifty times as religious as we are. If anybody told us that he himself was a saint, we should be shocked at his presumption. But the Bible and the Prayer Book have no such notion. Saint Paul usually calls all the people to whom he is writing, "saints," and then he goes on to warn them and scold them about sins that would shock Casanova. The saints are those who are set apart from the world by their faith in the Lord Jesus, and all believers in Jesus are the saints. The Communion of Saints is the brotherhood and companionship of all believers,—it is the blessed company of all faithful people. The Holy Catholic Church is also the blessed company of all faithful people, both those who have gone on before and us who are still in our pilgrimage. Whether we live or die, we belong to that fellowship, and nothing can separate us from our companionship with one another.

Therefore, we can in truth perceive "the presence of those dear saints gone before." Of course the old companionship that we once had is no more. We can no longer see their faces or hear their voices. We cannot talk to them or they to us. The old topics—the weather, jokes, business, picnics, gossip, and the like—none of those have any more place. That sort of fellowship is gone, and nothing can bring it back.

But even on earth, we do not find the strongest companionship through being mere chatterboxes. Often

the deepest companionship is found without words and without those common interests which seem so important but really lie only on the surface.

When two people can talk together, do business together, and sail or play bridge together, there is a tie that binds them. They have a certain fellowship. But if both are working or fighting side by side in a great cause, they can feel that cause uniting them far more strongly than the idle chit-chat of work and play. A cause can even draw people together who appear to have nothing in common. Those of you who have been in volunteer or paid war-work have probably found yourselves actually enjoying the company of people that you would never have met at tea or at bridge. People who work in church societies and committees find that companionship even in peacetime.

Or consider the fellowship in a family. Often a family is not most united when all are talking. We can think of evenings when the family is sitting quietly in the living room, the father reading the paper, the mother knitting or reading a book, while the young ones are pegging away at their lessons or sprawled on the floor reading the funnies, and no one speaks a word. Yet the oneness of the family is felt as stronger than steel.

The Communion of Saints is like both of these fellowships. It unites all in a great cause, that God's will may be done on earth as it is in heaven. And it is a family in which God is our Father and all of us are brothers and sisters.

O blest communion, fellowship divine;
We feebly struggle, they in glory shine;
Yet all are one in Thee for all are Thine.

Through our prayers and our labours, joined to the prayers of the saints on high, we are united in one great task. In Jesus Christ our Lord we are one with those whom we love, wherever they may be.

It is not an easy fellowship to find. The old common interests in work and play and even in the finer things of life, art, literature, music, and philosophy, no longer are enough. It is Christ alone who has conquered the barrier between us, and Christ alone can bind us to one another, but in Him alone is the Spirit of Love who gives meaning to all things, breaks down all barriers, and binds us forever in the family of God, in the body of Christ.

We can find that unity especially in the Lord's Supper, the family meal of Christendom. In that feast the barriers of time and place fall away, and we are back in that upper room where our Lord sat with the twelve. The table has been lengthened, and other generations have come to take their places there, people of other countries have drawn near, until we are all together. As we feed on the bread of angels, our boys in far off lands are gathered at their altars to do the same, and the faithful who have gone before us are there too—all of us gathered in that quiet upper room, as the glorified humanity of the Lord of Life comes into our hearts through His body and blood.

Through this life we are forever saying Good-bye. Time and distance, change and death, are ever present with us, and we never seem able to keep with us long those whom we hold most dear. But Christ is the victor over time and change, over distance, death, and hell, and by companionship with Him we enter the fellowship where there is no parting, where all are one in Him. "For I am persuaded that neither death, nor life,

nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

ON SUNDAY, JULY 6, 1941, in the little chapel which was erected many years ago, principally through the efforts of the Rev. Francis Goodwin, there was consecrated a beautifully carved communion rail in memory of Jean Wilson Brown, who died on September 8, 1939. She was the daughter of Mrs. John Cincinnatus (Grace Hall) Wilson and the late Mr. Wilson, and the memorial was the gift of Mrs. Wilson. The chapel contains a number of memorial gifts dedicated to the memory of past residents of Fenwick who worshipped there. Among them is the memorial window to the Right Rev. Cyrus F. Knight, former Bishop of Milwaukee, with an appropriate inscription written by the Rev. Francis Goodwin. A baptismal font which stands near the altar and communion rail, is consecrated to the memory of John Hall Wilson and Elisabeth Wilson, deceased children of John C. and Grace Hall Wilson.

At a service held later in the summer of 1941, Rev. Dr. Ogilby, President of Trinity College, explained in detail the remarkable carving of the figures and the rail, which had been placed in service on the day of its consecration. This was of great interest, and so important to proper consideration of the symbolical meaning that he was prevailed upon to write a complete description of the altar rail and its delightful carving. Dr. Ogilby's article is, substantially, reproduced below.

First, regarding the artist who carved the work: he is John Gregory Wiggins of Pomfret, Connecti-

cut, who has taught at Groton and St. Paul's School, where he was a most effective teacher. His passion for carving, however, now takes up the greater part of his time. He is the creator of the wood-carving in Trinity College Chapel, which experts have pronounced representative of the best work of its kind in the United States. For this reason and for his knowledge of the symbolism appropriate to his art, Mr. Wiggins seemed to be the ideal man to do the communion rail for St. Mary's-by-the-Sea.

In creating this communion rail, Mr. Wiggins' idea was to represent, in symbolic form, the Holy Bible as the foundation of Christian faith. Of the eight carved figures, the four center ones represent the four Evangelists, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The figures next on each side of them are writers of the Epistles. On the extreme right and left, as one faces the altar, the figures represent the Old Testament, which was called "The Law and the Prophets" by the Hebrews. In addition to the carved figure a small medallion over the head of each, symbolic of the man represented, aids identification.

The first figure on the left is that of Moses. He is shown holding the tablets of the Law, and carved above his head is a serpent to illustrate the story of the Serpent in the Wilderness. Mr. Wiggins omitted that gruesome detail, for which there is a lack of historical foundation. The beauty of the carving of this communion rail is enhanced by understanding of its symbolism—and the faithful who meet at the altar rail for their communion are supported in their faith by this knowledge of the Word of God.

It is to be regretted that the short season of two months during which the chapel is open, limits so greatly the opportunity to study and become familiar with this lovely work of art. But it is viewed, loved and admired by the many friends of the Wilson family who are faithful attendants at the summer services at Fenwick.

A Description of the Chair and Kneeling Desk

After a service held in the summer of 1943 at the little chapel in Fenwick known as St. Mary's-by-the-Sea Dean Arthur F. McKenny who had just officiated at morning prayer was asked what article of furniture for the chapel was most needed. The Dean replied that a place for the clergyman to sit and kneel outside the rail would be most welcome.

On July 6, 1941 a memorial communion rail in old chestnut wood was dedicated to the memory of Jean Wilson Brown daughter of Mrs. John Cincinnatus (Grace Hall) Wilson. This rail was carved by John Gregory Wiggins of Pomfret, Connecticut whose work is especially exemplified for Connecticut people in Trinity College Chapel and in the Chapel at St. Paul's School. Therefore, in creating the present memorial recourse was had again to Mr. Wiggins to carve a chair and kneeling desk of the same material and of a character and symbolism appropriate to the place and purpose and in harmony with the communion rail. The memorial as conceived and executed by Mr. Wiggins may be described as follows:

A chair and kneeling desk constructed of old chestnut wood. The statuettes above the back of the chair are of Saints Peter and Paul the two great pillars of the church. Saint Peter holds the traditional key to heaven, Saint Paul his sword of martyrdom and the "Book". The grape and leaf design carry on the same motif as used in the altar rail where they stand for the holy communion, but here are to be taken as symbolic of Christ as the "vine". The vine is also a part of the arms of the Lords Proprietor and has been embodied in the Shield of the State.

On the left arm of the chair under Saint Paul is the eagle, our American emblem and as the eagle can gaze into the sun without blinking so the true Christian shall finally look upon God. The eagle is also a symbol of baptism.

On the right arm of the chair the pelican in her piety and self-sacrifice is symbolic of Christ. She draws blood from her breast to feed her young.

On the right-hand side of the chair is a linenfold decoration and on the left-hand the coat of arms of the Fenwicks.

The stool is also decorated with the vine and above the kneeling priest on each side stands the lion. The roaring Lion of Judah, symbolic of Christ and through his "tres naturas", the trinity. As the cubs are born dead and only brought to life on the third day by the roar of the father, the lion is connected with the idea of the resurrection.

The inscription on the chair is:

*To the glory of God and for the refreshment of his
ministers and in loving memory of Francis Goodwin
who designed and built the earlier portion of this
chapel and of Mary, his wife, the remembrance of
whose sweet presence lingers in this quiet place.*

A DESCRIPTION OF THE CARVINGS

The Reredos

The Reredos, like the Altar-Carvings, is the work of John Gregory Wiggins, who also made the Communion rail and the Chair and Kneeling-desk.

At the top of the Reredos, from Right to Left, are the figures of St. Peter, St. John the Baptist, St. John the Evangelist, and St. Andrew. SS. Peter and Andrew are Patrons of Fishermen. Below St. Peter is St. Brendan, Patron of Seamen, who is said to have discovered America about 600 A.D. Below St. Andrew is St. Cuthbert, who is also a Patron Saint of Sailors.

In the Linen Folds are the Pelican and the Phoenix with the Chalice.

Of the Pelican, St. Augustine says in his Commentary on Psalm cii, 6, "The males of these birds are wont to kill their young by blows of their beaks, and then to bewail their death for the space of three days. At length however the female inflicts a severe wound on herself, and letting her blood flow over the dead young ones, brings them to life again." The mother Pelican is therefore the symbol of Christ's giving His Blood to restore us to life.

The Phoenix was said to be a bird, the only one of its species, which lived in the parts of the East about Arabia. After living five hundred years, it would go to Heliopolis in Egypt, set fire to itself, and consume away on the Altar of the Temple of the Sun. From the ashes would arise on the next day a small sweet-smelling worm, which in three days would develop into a young bird, and on the fourth, in the full size and plumage of an adult Phoenix, it would return to its home. The Phoenix is therefore the symbol of the Resurrection.

The Chalice is the Cup used at the Holy Communion, and the Wafer represents the Bread. It is often shown with rays of light emanating from it to indicate our Lord's Real Presence in this Sacrament.

On the North End (Gospel side) of the Altar is the following inscription:

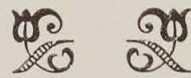

The carvings were executed by John Gregory Wiggins of Pomfret, Connecticut, and are described by him as follows

The Pew End depicts St. John the Baptist—the voice of one crying in the wilderness. He holds the banner “Ecce Agnus Dei” Behold the Lamb of God—under which is carved—“In memory of John Avery Ingersoll, who with his family worshipped in this church through many happy summers”.

The Kneeling Rail has the grape design carried on as in the Communion Rail over which is the inscription “Let not your heart be troubled neither let it be afraid” from St. John 14:27. The rail is upheld by four monks, suggesting the Cloister. From left to right:—

1. St. Francis known for his love of birds and animals.
2. St. Ceowulf who introduced wine and beer to make folk happier and who made it possible for the brethren to partake thereof instead of only water.
3. St. Baldomer—the pious blacksmith, a lover of birds.
4. Friar Tuck, a delightful character loved by everyone.

Above the figures are two conventional cornflowers, a golf bag, and the Book and Snake pin of the Cloister of Yale University.



The carved ends of the first pew are given in memory of

Stanley Adams Sweet
by his son, Clinton Wesley Sweet

The end by the center aisle shows St. Luke the Evangelist—the great physician and artist and the patron saint of artists and painters. Under this the inscription reads:

“In Memoriam Stanley Adams Sweet
gift of Clinton Wesley Sweet”

The other end has St. George, patron of all heroic attributes and soldierly qualities and patron saint of Boy Scouts, under which is the inscription

“The day is at hand let us put on the armour of light”
Romans 13:12

The carved ends of the second pew are given in memory of Henrietta Avery Ingersoll—the gift of her children, Grace Ingersoll Sweet and John Avery Ingersoll. On the center aisle end is carved St. Anne, mother of the Virgin, and patron Saint of Hearth and Home. She is encircled with garlands and flowers among them the bittersweet vine. The opposite end shows St. Cecilia—patron saint of music and flowers, with the inscription

“Blessed are the Pure in Heart for they shall see God.”
St. Matthew 5:8

The new organ now dedicated is a Baldwin Electronic Organ and has been made possible by gifts from interested summer residents.

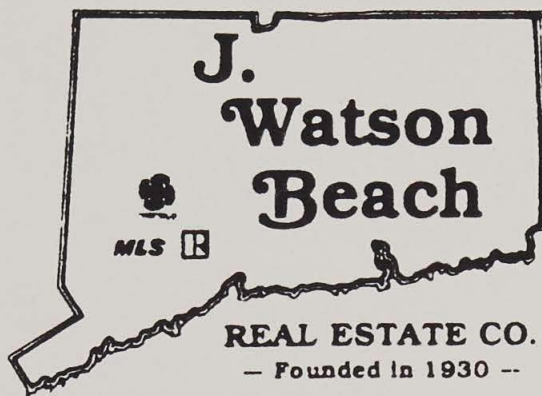


